Display Policy

At St Edmund's we believe that display is important because it:

- Celebrates children's work and provides the opportunity to share
- Sets standards of expectation and achievement within the school
- Enhances the learning environment and makes the school welcoming
- Can provide a stimulus for forthcoming work, triggering thoughts, discussions or activities
- Can aid and reinforce the learning already taking place

As a Roman Catholic school, our prayer corners should be a focal point of our classroom with artefacts and aids to prayer and thoughtfulness.

It is important for us to have continuity in display throughout the school, whilst retaining our individuality. The following points should be considered when putting up displays:

- The child's first name is clearly visible on the work, so that everyone can celebrate the child's achievement. The work is accessible to a wide range of audiences.
- Work should usually be mounted at least once, unless it is on a working wall
- Children's work is ideally put up with Blu-tack or wall staples
- Displays are clearly labelled with a title which engages the observer
- A range of curriculum areas will be displayed within the classroom

The following equipment is available to teachers to help with creating displays

- Staple gun
- Blu-tack
- Backing paper and border rolls
- Computer
