

Year 2 Newsletter Spring 2020

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back and Happy New Year!

I hope that you all had a fun Christmas holiday and are ready for a new term. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your kind and generous Christmas gifts, they were very much appreciated.

This term we will be starting a new topic called '**Castles, Knights and Princesses**'. All the work we do this term will be based around this topic. We will be learning about the history behind castles, looking at the battle of Hastings, different types of castles, the people who lived inside them and what castles were like inside. We also plan to visit Warwick Castle (details of this to follow closer to the time).

In **English** we will be continuing to work on handwriting, grammar, punctuation (including full stops, capital letters, question marks, exclamation marks and commas in lists), adding description into our work, writing in paragraphs and connecting and opening sentences in a variety of ways.

In **Maths** we will be covering addition, subtraction, number bonds, time, measure, money, odd and even numbers, multiplication, division, shape, fractions and problems solving.

Reading: Please make sure the children have their book bags in school daily to take full advantage of opportunities to read individually. If you wish to be a regular volunteer any help would be appreciated so, do please let us know. As you are aware your child will have much longer books to read now so it is not essential to read the whole book on the night they get them, but please do try to get your child to read to you daily for just 10/ 15 minutes, as this will continue to help with their fluency and understanding. When you read with your child please write in their reading record so we know when the children have finished their books so we can swap them over. I know this can be time consuming but even an initial would be helpful to know that your child has read to you at home.

PE: It is essential that the children have the correct PE kit in school. Their PE kits can be kept in the cloakroom for the term and will be taken home at the end of each term. This ensures the children do not forget to bring their kit to school. We have PE lessons on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons however this may change, or extra sessions may be added so this is another reason why they should be kept in school. The PE kit needed for school is as follows: 1 red polo shirt, 1 navy pair of shorts, 1 pair of trainers for outdoor PE, 1 pair of plimsolls for indoor PE. Also, our Daily Mile track is now in use so please make sure your child has their trainers in school each day.





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
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Homework: Homework will continue to be given out on a Friday and is expected in on Wednesday for marking.
