

Dear Parents/Carers,

As you know from my letter to you all earlier in the week, and from the recent news updates, the Government is hoping that children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 will return to school after the half term holiday. This return will depend on the infection rates and will only happen if the Government and their scientific advisors consider it safe to do so. We have now started to plan for this happening but it would greatly help if you could return the questionnaire I sent out earlier in the week, if you haven't done so already; but only if you have a child/ren in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 or Year 6. This will give us an indication of how many children may be returning to school after the holiday. As I said previously, this is entirely your decision as parents, we will not be pressurising you to do anything you are not comfortable with and you will not be fined for your child's non-attendance.

We are also planning for the current group of children of key workers and vulnerable children to continue to attend school, as now. We have, however decided to close to all pupils over the May half term and school will be closed on Monday 1st June for the planned INSET day. We will now use that day to prepare the classrooms and staff ready for an increase in attendance in those year groups from June 2nd, if the government and scientific advice deems it safe to do so.

I will send further details of drop off, pick up times and an outline of our plans to parents of Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 parents as soon as they are finalised. Please be aware that we will need parents to stick rigidly to the times and procedures we will be putting in place to help minimise the risk of infection and no parents will be allowed on site, all children will be dropped off and collected by staff from the school gate and walked directly into the classroom they will be using (which may not be their usual classroom) as classes will need to be spilt into at least two groups to help with distancing.

Thank you very much for continuing to engage so well with our home learning provision. There continues to be a high level of response in all year groups, which is certainly keeping the teachers busy! Can I politely ask some of you to consider the teachers' workload and family circumstances - many are juggling their own childrens' learning at home as well as trying to respond to and support all of the differing needs of children and parents from the class and taking their turn in teaching the children currently in school on a rota basis. Do remember they need evenings and weekends for down time too. We recognise the challenges that home learning brings to family life in difficult circumstances. Please be kind to yourselves and accept the limitations that you are working under in your household. I













Online Safety

Please be vigilant to on-line dangers at this time. The Thames Valley Police have issued the following advice.

Key message for children:

- Don't be afraid of coming forward and speaking to a parent, carer, guardian, teacher or other trusted adult.
- The Police are here to help and support you you will not be in trouble.
- Know who you are talking to on-line. If something doesn't feel right tell someone.

Key messages for parents:

- Trust your instinct for signs, you know your child better than anyone
- Have your children suddenly become very secretive?
- Are they sad or withdrawn but won't say why?
- Do they seem distracted
- Do they have sudden mood swings?
- Are they unable to switch off from their phone or social media?
- Have open conversations with children about their internet usage.
- Use parental controls and seek quidance from the available free resource.
